Course Information

This unit of competency covers the mandatory work health and safety training required prior to undertaking construction work in Western Australia. The unit requires successful demonstration of personal awareness, personal safety, and knowledge of health and safety legislative requirements in order to work safely and prevent injury or harm to self and others.

It covers identifying and reporting common construction hazards, understanding basic risk control measures, and identifying procedures for responding to potential incidents and emergencies. It also covers correctly selecting and fitting common personal protective equipment (PPE) used for construction work.

This course complies with Work Health and Safety (WHS) legislation requiring induction training for anyone wishing to work in the construction industry or go onto a construction site within Australia.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- have suitable English language proficiency and Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) skills at least to the level of Year 10 or equivalent (demonstrated via the Essential Training pre-enrolment evaluation)
